AWS DNA Sample Collection Campaign FREE DNA Collection Clinic at Nationals

WHY? This initiative of the AWSC Health & Genetics Committee seeks to collect as many AWS DNA samples as possible, along with corresponding health information about each dog, for the Canine Health Information Center (CHIC) DNA Bank. This will facilitate future research and testing aimed at reducing the incidence of inherited diseases in our dogs. Based on results gained from past blood samples (cardiac, epilepsy, and degenerative myelopathy), more discriminating AWS breeding practices have been implemented.



Area Attractions

Clintonville's Four Wheel Drive Museum

Did you know that Clintonville is the home of the Four Wheel Drive? It is! Two Clintonville machinists, Otto Zachow and William Besserdich, developed the first effective four wheel drive automobile, and, in 1909, formed the Four Wheel Drive Auto Company, with the help of local lawyer, Walter Olen (for whom Olen Park was named.) A few years later, the Company's emphasis changed to trucks. It developed and manufactured mail carriers, ammunition carriers (20,000 for our WW I forces), highway and road maintenance vehicles, firetrucks, race cars, and more.

The Four Wheel Drive Museum in Clintonville has two locations: one is in the original machine shop where it all started, and contains a sampling of the vehicles designed and manufactured during the Company's history. This facility is at 40 East 11th Street, very near Olen Park. A new 65,000 square foot facility is just being opened at 325 16th Street, and will contain many historic vehicles. Typically, the Museum is only open on Saturday afternoons, when many of us will be in the field. However, we have arranged for a special guided tour to take place on Wednesday afternoon, August 2, 2017, at 2:30 PM at the "old museum" on 11th Street.

Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame — The 15,000 square foot, two-level Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame is conveniently located on the main floor of the Lambeau Field Atrium, across from 1919 Kitchen & Tap. A tribute to the greatest story in sports, the new facility uses the latest technology, enhanced interactive displays and a treasure trove of artifacts to educate and inspire visitors about the rich history of the Packers, as well as the teams of today. Guests are able to see Packers legends describe historic games in their own words, and can scroll through touch screens to click on audio segments and game video clips that tell the team's story. The Hall of Fame also displays trophies from the Packers' 13 world championships, including four Lombardi trophies, as well as the hall's most popular exhibit: a replica of Vince Lombardi's office. The exciting and historical galleries appeal to visitors of all ages.

Heritage Hill State Historic Park — Located on the banks of the Fox River, Heritage Hill is a living history museum with 26 buildings located on 50 acres, tracing the Region's history from the French fur traders of the 1600s to the 1940s. While you walk through the Park on a self-guided tour, Historical Interpreters in period costume will greet you at various buildings throughout the Park. Travel through 4 different time periods in the Park's La Baye (Fur Trade), Fort Howard, Growing Community, and Ethnic Agriculture areas. National Railroad Museum — The museum is one of the oldest institutions in the United States dedicated to preserving and interpreting the nation's railroad history. Combined AKC/AWSC Hunt Tests — Doubling Down!

The 2017 Nationals will be the second AWSC nationals to have not only the two AWSC hunt tests, but also <u>TWO</u> AKC Spaniel Hunt tests. This will provide each entry with a chance to double down and earn not only the traditional AWSC hunt test pass towards the AWSC title, but also an AKC spaniel hunt test pass. All for the same entry fee!

This is exciting for us, and we hope for the handlers and dogs. This message is to communicate why we did this, and what you as handlers need to consider. It may get a little long, and for that we apologize.

We have decided to repeat the "dual" tests this year, based on the very positive feedback from 2016, and to offer better value to the members. The AKC spaniel test and the flushing parts of the AWSC test are extremely similar. The AWSC tests have a lot more retrieving in them, as well as an extra level (for a total of 4 levels). The basics of what we will do at this year's nationals is use the AKC test as the flushing portion of the AWSC tests. If a handler wants to, he can enter only the AKC portion of the test. If a handler wants to run the AWSC working certificate test, he will enter both the AKC test and the appropriate level of AWSC test.

<u>AWSC test and what to do if you want to participate</u>. The first step will be to decide what level <u>AWSC</u> test you want to run and enter that level. The second step would be to pick the appropriate AKC spaniel test level that would satisfy the requirements. Since we have 4 levels of AWSC tests and only three levels of AKC tests, there will be one crossover. Below is the guideline-

AWSC Started- AKC Junior Hunter AWSC Working Dog- AKC Senior Hunter AWSC Working Dog Excellent- AKC Senior Hunter AWSC Working Dog Superior- AKC Master Hunter

These AKC levels provide the basis for flushing work that will satisfy the AWSC requirements at each level. Although there could be combinations that will work, this is highly recommended from the hunt test committee.

<u>Changes in 2017 format (from 2016) and Why</u>. This year, the Hunt Test Committee's goal is to streamline the tests and run them more efficiently than in 2016. <u>Each</u> Dog and handler will move on to the next test component when they have completed a test component. Basically, if a dog and handler is not waiting to run or running a specific AKC test, they should be waiting to run or running a specific AWSC test, and vice versa, in order to speed up the testing process. Test locations will be in close proximity to one another, so handlers and dogs will not have difficulty moving between tests. (So, to put it simply, when you complete a test component, go to the next test. Little or no waiting!)

Important Notes.

There are slight differences in the AKC and AWSC tests that make some crossover impossible. For example, the AKC Spaniel Senior and Master have an extra testing element, a hunt dead test, that is not part of any AWSC tests. While this is a component to passing the AKC portion of the test, it will not affect the ability of the handler to move on to the AWSC portion of the test. Passing the AKC test is not a requirement for moving on, but passing the elements of flushing would be.

Please familiarize yourself with the RULES of BOTH the AKC and the AWSC tests. The rules for both can be found on the Club's website.

Rosettes will be awarded for both tests each evening.

The Hunt Test entry form is a separate full-size page located in the Center of this booklet. Please remember, if you are going to run the AWSC portion of the test, check boxes at the AWSC and the AKC section. If you are running only the AKC portion, you only need to check that portion. The hunt test secretary's job is difficult enough! Please make sure to complete the form correctly!


